<b>Course Objectives</b>	The main objectives of this course are to provide an overview of the field of Forensic Psychology and the Applications of Psychology within the legal and criminal justice system. This lesson covers the following topics: Crime and criminal behavior, knowledge and practice of forensic psychology, the role and functions of forensic psychologists in the justice system. Particular emphasis will be placed on the applied aspects of the subject.
<b>Course Contents</b>	This course is designed to provide an understanding of the relationship between psychology and law by showing how research and theory in the field of psychology inform the legal process. The leading topics include crime and guilt, violence, social risk factors, victims of crime, corrective mechanisms, the way courts work, testimony from child witnesses and ethical issues. Students will be properly introduced to the practical application of relevant theory and research to real-life events, and they will be made to practice.
